It's our great pleasure to invite your National Ski Association to the **2022 FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships** at Panorama, British Columbia, Canada.

For more than 40 years, teams from around the globe have chosen Panorama Mountain Resort for incredible snow quality and reliability. Above all else though, they come to work alongside experienced volunteers and a resort crew who passionately run a top-class training and racing venue. With impressive facilities and a proven track record, Panorama is North America's prime setting for this prestigious event. The championships will take place from March 1st to March 9th, 2022, with the following competition program:

This is the first time the FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships will be held in Western Canada and the 40th anniversary of this prestigious event.

#### **ENTRIES**

Entries must be completed through the FIS online registration system in accordance with the following deadlines:

#### Preliminary entries by number: December 15th, 2021

The preliminary number of team members (women and men), including competitors and officials.

## Final entries by name: No later than 7 days before the first team captains meeting (or until February 21st, 2022)

Must include:

- The number, name and date of birth of each competitor
- The number, name and date of birth of each official and service staff member
- The exact date of arrival and departure

## Any alterations: No later than 7 days before the first team captains meeting (or until February 21st, 2022)

The Organizing Committee (OC) will invoice the costs incurred for cancelled accommodation (per rule 10 WJC Rules) to the concerned National Organization.

### **ATHLETES & OFFICIALS**

To be eligible for participation in the FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships, the competitors must be citizens of the country entering them, have a valid FIS code and be born in the years 2001-2005.

The goal of the OC is to run a full competition program for the FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships, but with a reduced quota of competitors and officials. Each National Ski Association may participate with a total of 12 competitors, with no more that 8 of the same gender. A maximum of 4 women and 4 men may start per event. In Downhill a maximum number of 8 athletes (including ZK quota) per gender may take part in official training.

The ZK quota is valid for all five events (DH, SG, AC, SL and GS). Two ZK competitors may be entered in addition to the four competitors per nation. Qualification of the ZK athletes follows <u>6.1.1 of the WJC Rules</u>. Teams cannot make any changes to the ZK competitors after the first race.

A maximum of 16 officials may be entered per national team (men and women).

Please note: The official service personnel of the ski companies are not included in these quotas.





#### **COVID-19 PROTOCOLS**

Registration within the FIS Passport system is mandatory for **all team participants** requesting accreditation.

All international guests must meet **<u>Government of Canada</u>** requirements for entering the country. All COVID-19 health orders and protocols specific to the event will be regularly updated at <u>**Panorama2022.com**</u>

As of November 21st, 2021, the following COVID-19 vaccines are approved in Canada:

#### **MEDICAL PLAN AND ANTI-DOPING**

The full medical plan will be available on <u>Panorama2022.com</u> at least six weeks prior to the championships. The CCES will be performing anti-doping onsite daily. The facilities will be near the finish area.

#### **RACE OFFICE**

The race office is located in the Copper Crown Conference Centre at Panorama Mountain Resort. It will be open as of Sunday, February 27th until Thursday, March 10th, from 7AM to 8PM.

#### ACCOMMODATION

Teams will be accommodated by the OC with lodging at Panorama Mountain Resort. All condos and hotel rooms are located within walking distance of the lifts. Specific building assignments will be confirmed upon arrival at the Race Office. The daily rate is CHF 90 per night (incl. lodging, meals & lift ticket). This rate is only valid from Monday, February 28th to Thursday March 10th inclusive. Lodging stays and training may be available before or after the defined period, please contact <u>racing@panoramaresort.com</u> for more information.

#### **MEALS**

All meals are served in the Great Hall. Schedule and menus will be communicated upon arrival. Please send any dietary restrictions with your entries.

### **TUNING ROOMS**

A tuning space will be assigned to each National Organization. They are located in the underground parkades of some lodging buildings or in the Upper Village parking lot trailers.

#### ARRIVAL

With views to the Canadian Rockies, Panorama Mountain Resort is perched high in the Purcell Mountains just 18km west of Invermere, British Columbia. It is a 3.5-hour drive from Calgary International Airport, with daily flights from major European and North American cities. Shuttles can be arranged by the OC (by February 1st, 2022 – additional cost). Car or truck rentals can be secured through Budget Rent a Car. #### **INSURANCE FOR TEAMS**

All stakeholders in the 2022 FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships must have valid insurance covering medical costs, accidents, transportation, injury, and illness as per FIS rules.

#### **RADIO LICENSES**

Teams are responsible for their own communication plans and equipment. Please be aware of the Canadian radiocommunication regulations. Regulations must be followed to avoid any interference with local/regional businesses and emergency services. Panorama reserves the right to remove any equipment that is not deemed appropriate or equipment that creates interference. Cellular coverage on the race course is very good.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS MEETING**

The first Team Captains Meeting will be Monday, February 28th, 2021, at 5PM. All team captains' meetings will take place in the Copper Crown Conference Centre.

#### **TRAINING INFORMATION**

Training space (GS and SL) will be available during the competition on a team shared basis. Gates for training purposes can be rented for a reasonable fee, including a deposit for broken, damaged or lost / missing gates.
